What does the Lord require of you?

He requires only that you fear the Lord your God, and live in a way that pleases Him, and love Him and serve Him with all your heart and soul.

And you must always obey the Lord's commands. Dt. 10:12

(the Ten Commandments can be found in Dt. 20.)

The first 4 are between us and God, the last 6 are between us and others.

Jesus summarized them in Mark 28: 29-31 when he said *"Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul and will all your mind and with all your strength. The second is this: Love your neighbor as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these."*

And the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against these things there is no law. Gal. 5:22-26.

A is for Accountability. You are directly responsible to the staff person with whom you are working or volunteering. Take direction and implement their requests as a team player. Dress for success.

B is for Being a Raving Fan! Share the great things you witness in the classroom and around the campus. Praise publicly and admonish privately.

There is NEVER a reason to humiliate or embarrass a child (or adult) intentionally.

Raising your voice should only occur if danger is eminent.

C is for Care enough to Communicate when you don't understand something. Talk with the staff person specifically about the issue in question. Communication brings wisdom and understanding.
