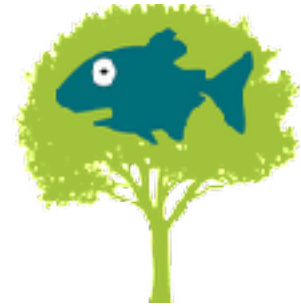


**6th Grade Summer Reading Assignment

Once you finish reading the book, you must complete **two** assignments.

Both assignments are major grades and must be turned in on **Friday, August 31, 2018**, for full credit.

Assignment 1 - Chapter Journal Sheets

Basic Requirements:

1. Handout given in class and Online
2. **Fill out the Table as you read.** Include the following information:
 - Chapter
 - Characters - Which Character(s) are included in the chapter
 - Setting - Location the chapter takes place
 - Quote from the Chapter - include page number please
 - Summary of the chapter - these can be bulleted points of the major interest or things that happened in the chapter
3. Do this for **ALL** of the chapters in the book.

This will help you better understand the events taking place in the book.
4. Staple all your pages in numerical order by chapter.
5. Include your full name and class in the upper **RIGHT HAND CONER** of the first page.
6. **WRITE NEATLY IN PRINT.** If I can not read it, I will not grade it.

NOTE: You are welcome to down load and type your pages if you would like.

Assignment 2 - Chose Your Own Final Book Project

Basic Requirements:

1. Chose one project, from the provided list of book projects, to do for the novel.
2. Make sure to follow all directions exactly for the best possible grade.
3. Neatness and clear concise writing is expected
4. Take your time to do your best possible work
5. **DO NOT WAIT UNTIL THE LAST MINUTE TO PUT THE PROJECT TOGETHER**
